Refugees and Asylum Seekers

We have become used to other people's suffering, it doesn't concern us, It doesn't interest us, it's none of our business.

This quote from Pope Francis is unfortunately a true and sad reflection of our society as it stands today. Each day, 23,000 people are forced to flee their country leaving behind their families, homes and possessions to try and keep themselves alive. Even more heartbreaking is that our politicians continue to use these people as a political tool in their campaigns, using fear to obtain votes and give false information. As a Catholic school in the Edmund Rice Tradition, it is up to us to educate our boys to have a better understanding of the plights of people throughout the world and also to be a voice for people who have no voice, for if we do not stand up for people less fortunate than us. who will?

Globally, Australia is ranked 47th for hosting refugees according to the UNHCR. Australia's Refugee and Humanitarian Program re-settles 20,000 refugees each year. This increase came as part of the Houston Expert Panel recommendations in 2012, increasing the number from 13,750. Australia is in the top three countries for resettlement of refugees. The USA, Canada and Australia provide 90 percent of global re-settlement places. In 2012, asylum seeker applications in Australia accounted for just over 3 percent of the global share. Refugees and asylum seekers coming to Australia account for just a small fraction of Australia's annual permanent immigration. In 2012 and 2013, Australia has seen a significant increase in the number of boat arrivals. In 2012 there were 17,202 arrivals. This seems like a large amount, although globally it is relatively small. According to a UNHCR report, 23,000 people around the world are forced to flee their homes each day, in search of asylum.

It's official! The Waterford Learning Centre is a GREAT SCHOOL LIBRARY!

In October 2015, **FAIR** (Freedom of Access to Information and Resources) asked for nominations for **Great School Libraries** across Australia. To be accepted, the following criteria had to be met.

Could the library help young people to:

- find reliable information and use it effectively?
- think critically and make informed decisions?
- work productively with others to build knowledge?
- safely navigate the internet?
- communicate and share their ideas?
- find great reads to meet personal interests and abilities?

Members of the school community made a number of submissions in support of the Waterford Learning Centre at CBHSL and the answer was YES! Staff at the Waterford Learning Centre facilitate all this and more, and have been recognised as one of Australia's Great School Libraries for 2015.

The Waterford Learning Centre is fortunate to have two professional teacher librarians, both with recent Masters Degrees specialising in e-Learning and Information Literacy. The team is completed by the dedicated support staff who work to ensure the library runs smoothly.

We are fortunate to have a budget which enables us to purchase a wide range of quality literature to support our reading programs – STAR Reading during Home Room for all year groups, Accelerated Reader in Years 5 and 6, the Edmund Rice Wide Reading Challenge in Years 7 to 10, and the Book Club (which combines sessions with girls' school Domremy College) for Years 9 to 12.

The Waterford Learning Centre home page has links to online resources that support teaching and learning, and allows access to databases, referencing support, and specially curated websites. Both Mrs Toohey and Ms Martin work cooperatively with teachers to provide orientation to classes for these web-based materials.

The physical environment of the library is spacious and conducive to a wide range of leisure and academic pursuits, providing both individual and collaborative learning spaces. In the words of one student who wrote a submission:

like coming to my school library because lenjoy the peace and tranquillity. When I walk through the library doors, I feel happy — like walking through a curtain and seeing a new world on the other side.


