YEAR 12 RITE OF PASSAGE

This year our senior students will be participating in a Rite of Passage here at the school. It will be a time of reflection on the past and looking forward to the future. It will involve Eucharist and Reconciliation and be a good psychological process to assist our young men at this most significant time of transition. Unfortunately in Australian society, young males can too easily become a part of dangerous "Rites of Passage" where drugs, crimes and inappropriate expressions of sexuality are practised "to become a man".

Rites of passage are powerful social activities or ceremonies that mark an evolution from one stage in life to another. In addition to defining character and identity, they provide a sense of achievement and purpose. One of the most critical transitions, and one particularly pertinent to CBHS Lewisham, is from adolescence to adulthood. This is a time when much hangs in the balance for each young person to ensure progress towards a positive and successful future of spiritual development, healthy relationships and positive community interaction.

HSC MINIMUM STANDARDS TEST ROUND 2

From 2020, students in NSW must meet the minimum standard of literacy and numeracy to be eligible for the Higher School Certificate (HSC) credential.

Year 10 and 11 students, who did not meet the HSC minimum standards during the 2019 Round One online testing or were absent, will have the opportunity to try again during Term 3 2019.

Given NESA's guidelines, and our capacity to facilitate these online tests, we will be offering access to Round Two of these online tests on **Tuesday**, **10**th **September 2019** at school during **Periods 1-3**. To access the online test(s) students are required to bring to school their laptop (fully charged) and earphones.

Students taking the test have been informed via letter in May 2019 and will also have a meeting with the DLC Coordinator in the coming weeks.


