YEAR 11 2019

Year 11 Academic and Pastoral Care Reports will be uploaded to the Sentral Parent Portal (only) at the end of Week 2, Term 4.

I spoke to Year 11 students at the end of Term 3 about their final year of schooling at Lewisham and our expectations of them as a senior student and maximising dally efforts in their learning. In the final week of Term 3, students were provided the opportunity to participate in an engaging presentation from Elevate in which strategies for HSC preparation, study and success were shared.

In Week 2, Term 4 of 2019, Year 11 students will commence HSC work and assessment tasks. In Week 2, Year 11 students will receive a personalised barcoded paper copy of the CBHS Lewisham Higher School Certificate Assessment Information & School Assessment Policy for Year 12 (2020). A copy of this document will also be available on our school based Learning Circles Weebly. This handbook includes the school assessment HSC policy, some important assessment forms (Illness/Misadventure Form) as well as an outline of the assessment requirements for the HSC course for each subject (number and nature of assessment tasks, outcomes, assessment weightings).

Parents and carers are asked to go through this handbook with their sons to ensure familiarity with procedures and policies and that they are followed. These procedures and policies are in place to ensure equity and justice and we appreciate your support of the CBHS Lewisham Higher School Certificate Assessment Information & School Assessment Policy for Year 12 (2020).

As of Week 4, Term 4 all HSC assessment dates for Term 4 will be conveniently recorded in a very user-friendly manner on the online school calendar. Assessment tasks for 2020 will be entered onto the school calendar at the commencement of the 2020 academic school year.

When you go to the school website and click on "calendar" on the bottom blue bar, you will access our Google calendar. You will see all CBHS dates and events at first, but you can easily narrow the dates down to a specific year group by the drop down menu on the right-hand side of the calendar. By doing this you will only see the assessment dates for the year group you have selected. The information here will be updated regularly and will provide you with the most current assessment information. If you wish to print the dates, click on "Agenda" in the top right corner of the calendar and you will be given a printer-friendly list of the dates.

Again, we trust that this online calendar will further enhance our work in partnership in your son's education.

WLC AFTER SCHOOL GROUP

The After School Group runs in the Waterford Learning Centre from 3:15 to 5:15 pm after school on Mondays, Tuesdays and Wednesdays, and is open to all students in Years 5 to 12. Both a copy of the permission slip and the online sign up are available through this link. Please note that there are different links for Primary and Secondary students. I strongly encourage all students to take part in this worthwhile activity in order to further their studies.

APPLICATIONS FOR 2020 HSC DISABILITY PROVISIONS ARE NOW BEING ACCEPTED

DISABILITY PROVISIONS FOR STUDENTS GOING INTO YEAR 12 IN 2020

The NSW Education Standards Authority (NESA) grants Disability Provisions to some students for the Higher School Certificate. Please read the following information carefully, it may relate to your son.

Disability provisions in the HSC are practical arrangements <u>designed to help students</u> who couldn't otherwise make a fair attempt to show what they know in an exam room. The provisions granted are solely determined by how the student's exam performance is affected.

WHO MAY BE ELIGIBLE TO APPLY FOR PROVISIONS?

Students with:

- learning difficulties or disabilities such as dyslexia, dysgraphia and dyscalculia
- intellectual disabilities
- mental illness
- emotional and behavioural disturbances
- Autism Spectrum Disorder
- sensory impairment
- physical disabilities such as cerebral palsy
- speech and language disorders
- chronic illness

WHAT ARE SOME OF THE PROVISIONS?

- A reader and/or writer.
- Extra time.
- Rest breaks.
- Separate supervision.
- Special seating within the hall.
- Diabetic provisions.
- Individual provisions for students with a hearing or vision impairment (including colour blindness).

HOW DOES MY SON APPLY?

- He should go to the Diverse Learning Centre and speak with Ms Nichol, Ms Parker or Ms Cleaver.
- There will be specialist reports you need to obtain.

Applications are due into NESA by the end of Term 1 2020 but may be submitted from Term 4 2019. The earlier the application is completed, the sooner we know the outcome. Students who are granted HSC Disability Provisions have them for the whole of Year 12 – assessment tasks and all examinations.

There is no notation for marking of papers or on the Higher School Certificate itself that indicates provisions have been used.
